

Diane Ravitch is a historian of American education at New York University. A prolific writer who has published more than 500 articles and reviews for scholarly and popular publications on the subject, Ravitch is internationally acclaimed

for her expertise on past and present education.

Her latest book, "The Death and Life of the Great American School System," is a national best seller. As assistant Secretary of Education and Counselor to Secretary of Education, Lamar Alexander, from 1991 to 1993, she led the federal effort to promote the creation of voluntary state and national academic standards. Appointed a member of the Nations Assessment Governing Board in 1997 and reappointed in 2001, she oversaw the National Assessment of Educational Progress.

She is a graduate of the Houston public schools, Wellesley College (BA), and Columbia University (Ph.D.). In 2011, she received the Daniel Patrick Moynihan Award from the American Academy of Political and Social Sciences for her careful use of data and research to advance the common good.
